**Fundraising Society:** The primary role of a fundraising society is to raise funds that support the school program and extracurricular activities.

Education and Childcare is once again providing a grant, in the amount of \$500 per school council, to support councils in fulfilling their legislated responsibilities in the education system and enhancing parental involvement and engagement.

Examples of parent engagement activities and projects, as defined by Education and Childcare, that the funds may support include:

- Workshops for parents to increase capacity for school council members;
- Information sessions on how parents can support student learning at home and at school;
- Parent resources and workshops on topics such as: mental health and well-being, cyber bullying, healthy living etc.;
- Programs to support multi-cultural and Indigenous families;
- Parent resources and tools in multiple languages;
- Events to engage parents on important local issues;
- Conference fees;
- Parent engagement in promoting the value of arts; and
- Trainer/facilitator costs for the professional development, workshops or sessions associated with the above.

The funds cannot be used for the following:

**Entertainment costs, meals, snacks or other food;**

- Capital asset purchases (i.e. furniture, technology, etc.);
- Activities that have occurred prior to the date of the provision of funds;
- Organization membership;
- Fundraising events;
- Prizes or incentives for parents and/or students;
- Payment to school board staff (honoraria, gifts); or
- Entertainment activities such as barbeques, volunteer teas, dances, concerts or performances, etc.

The CBE has arranged for pre-paid cards that can be used to access this year's funds plus any unused funds from the prior year (the amount of the card will be noted on the bottom left of the page that the credit card is attached to). These cards will be mailed to the school principal the week of November 10. Please connect with the principal to get the card. In order to have the card released to you, a declaration form must be signed and given to the school to send to Heather Kirkwood at the Education Centre. A copy is attached for your information.

**Cards will be activated centrally for November 13 (there may be a sticker on the card to call to activate but please ignore). There is no pin required to use the card,**
